**SUMMARY REPORT**

This is a yearly report on community activities conducted during the year 2022. The objective of these activities was to draw public attention to oral and dental issues, raise awareness about common oral diseases and ways of prevention together with field learning experience for dental students. The following are the summary details for the community programs conducted:

- A total of **8** community activities were conducted.
- A total of **9** faculty members participated.
- A total of **110** students and **20** intern doctors participated.
- A total of **1434** public participants benefitted from the community activities.

# 1. ALWAQDI INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL, ABHA

ACTIVITY DATE: 20<sup>TH</sup> AND 27<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the children about oral health at AlWaqdi Intermediate School, Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. On the first day, oral health screening was done by 14 male students from level 11. The children needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. A total of 215 children were examined under 4 faculty supervisors. The second visit was planned for oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models.

The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

## 2. Mohammad Bin Sirin Intermediate School, Abha

Activity Date: 21st and 28th March 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the children about oral health at Mohammad Bin Sirin Intermediate School, Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. On the first day, oral health screening was done by 15 male students from level 11. The children needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. A total of 195 children were examined under 4 faculty supervisors. The second visit was planned for oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models.

The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

### 3. AlSharaf Intermediate and High School, Abha Activity Date: 22nd and 29th March 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the children about oral health at AlSharaf Intermediate and high school, Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. On the first day, oral health screening was done by 27 female students from level 11. The children needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. A total of 198 children were examined under 3 faculty supervisors. The second visit was planned for oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models. Children were given demonstration on use of mouth rinse. Free toothpastes and toothbrushes were distributed as gifts.

The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

#### 4. Gulf Oral Health Week, Ahad Rafeida General Hospital Activity Date: 21<sup>st</sup> March 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the general public about oral health at General Hospital, Ahad Rafeida. The program was conducted as a single day activity to celebrate Gulf Oral Health Week, 2022. The students were engaged in oral health education using educational videos, Posters, Brochures and Tooth models. A total of 184 people participated the program. A total of 10 interns conducted the program under one faculty supervisors. The overall feedback from the students regarding the program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

## 5. Gulf Oral Health Week, Hi-City Abha Activity Date: 27th, 28th and 29th March 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the general public about oral health at Hi-City, Abha. The program was organized by KKUCOD Student Club as a 3-day activity to celebrate Gulf Oral Health Week, 2022. All participants attending were screened for oral health problems and those needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. The students were engaged in oral health education using Posters, Brochures and Tooth models. Children participants were given colouring activities on topics related to tooth. Free toothbrushes and toothpastes were distributed as gifts. A total of 184 people participated the program. A total of 18 students conducted the program under one faculty supervisors. The overall feedback from the students regarding the program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

## 6. Mohammad Bin Sirin Intermediate School, Abha

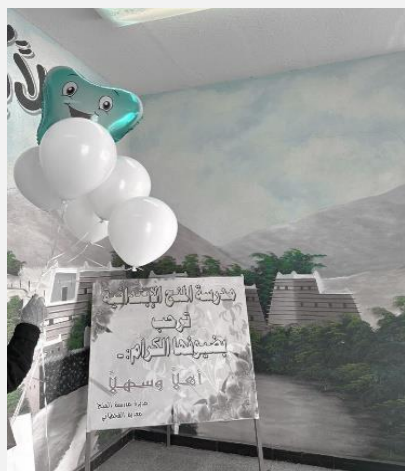
Activity Date: 18th and 25th October 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the children about oral health at Mohammad Bin Sirin Intermediate School, Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. On the first day, oral health screening was done by 27 male students from level 11. The children needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. A total of 257 children were examined under 4 faculty supervisors. The second visit was planned for oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models.

The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.

## 7. AlMinah Primary and Intermediate School, Abha Activity Date: 20th and 27th October 2022

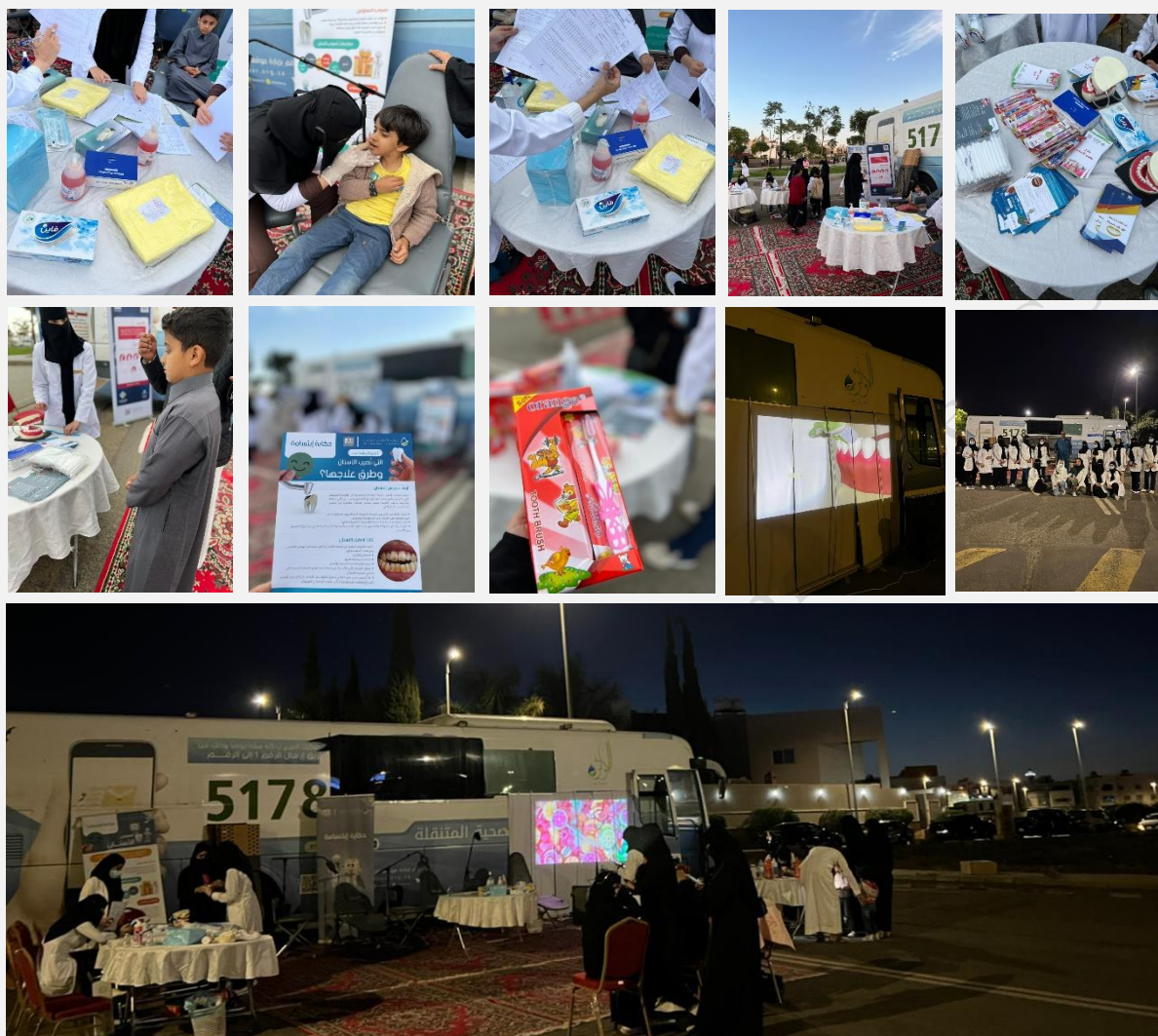


The objective of this community program was to educate the children about oral health at AlMinah Primary and Intermediate school, Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. On the first day, oral health screening was done by 9 female students from level 11. The children needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. A total of 91 children were examined under 2 faculty supervisors. The second visit was planned for oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models. Children were given demonstration on use of mouth rinse. Free toothbrushes and toothpastes were distributed as gifts.

The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.



## 8. KKU-IPC Community Activity with AlKawther Health Association, Abha Activity Date: 25th and 26th October 2022



The objective of this community program was to educate the general public about oral health and provide topical fluoride application for children. This activity was conducted in collaboration with AlKawther Health Association in Abha. The program was planned as a 2-day activity. Oral health screening was done by 10 female internship doctors under 2 faculty supervisors. A total of 203 patients participated. All participants needing dental treatment were given referral forms to visit KKUCOD clinics. Oral health education using PowerPoint presentations, Posters and Tooth models was done. Participants were given demonstration on toothbrushing method. Free toothbrushes and toothpastes were distributed as gifts. The overall feedback from the recipients of program was positive. A detailed evaluation of each feedback question did not indicate any problem areas. The program was considered to be successful.
