<b>Quantity Category:</b> This category honors researchers who have demonstrated a prolific and consistent record of scholarly output. <b>Faculty Category:</b> This category acknowledges the exemplary community service efforts of college staff members who have demonstrated unwavering commitment to improving the well-being of the community through various initiatives, both within and beyond their job roles. <b>Student Category:</b> The student category celebrates dental students' exceptional dedication and efforts and their significant contributions to the community through volunteer work, projects, or initiatives related to oral health or general community well-being.
